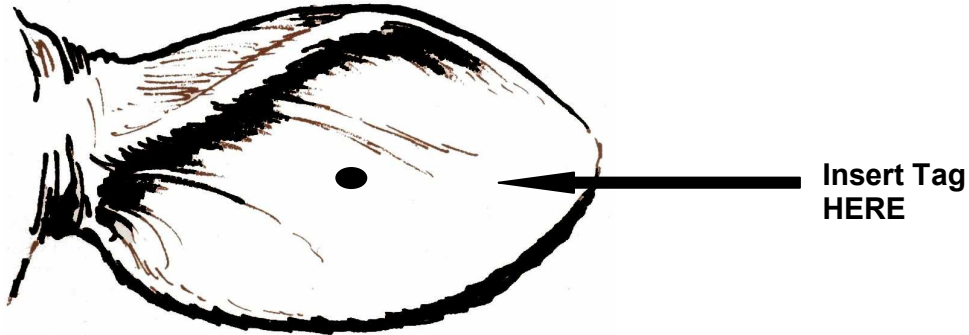

## TAGGING TIPS

- Keep tags sealed in their bags until ready for use.
- Ensure tag is inserted in the correct position in the middle of the ear, between the two cartilage ribs.



- Avoid tagging in damp overcast weather as these conditions increase the risk of infection.
- Avoid tagging animals when they are stressed in any way.
- The surgical tip on Zee Tags eliminates the need to use disinfectant on tags or animals.
- **Do Not** tag animals with ringworms or warts.
- Avoid cross contamination with other chemicals or treatments.
- Keep dust in the yards to a minimum.
- Clean and maintain applicator with the occasional spray of CRC on working parts.
- When applying ZEE Tags, always keep your hand fully closed and drag away, as opening your hand can cause the tag to jam or it may not lock fully into position due to the fact that it has not fully penetrated the ear. Both the tag and the ear should be held when pulling the applicator away.

## TAGGING TIPS

- When tagging day old calves, goats, or young sheep – it is possible for the ear to fold into the applicator hole due to the softness of the animal's ear. This can potentially cause jamming of the applicator and ripped ears. To rectify this problem, simply hold the end of the ear taut to avoid it folding in. The application will then run smoothly.
- When tagging bulls, the use of extra large tags is not recommended. The tags should also be placed closer to the head to improve retention.
- When tagging with two-piece tags, ensure that the female cone is on the front of the ear to assist in retention.
- Do not allow chemicals to come into contact with ear whilst wound is healing. Avoid topical application of chemicals whilst handling.
